

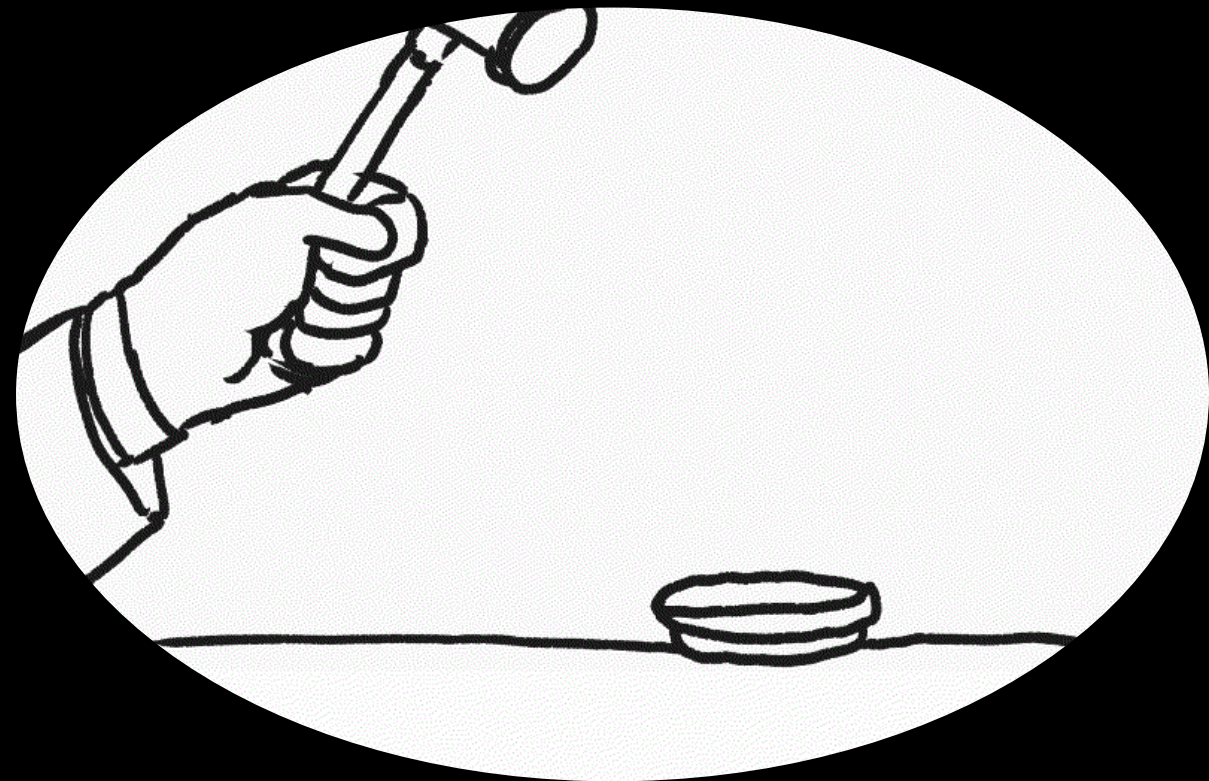

- E2 Critical evaluation of decisions made in response to challenges and/or opportunities specific to the research processes used.
- E3 Insightful evaluation of the quality of the Research Outcome.

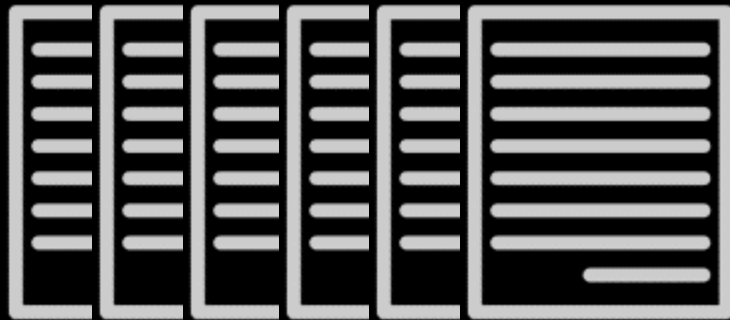

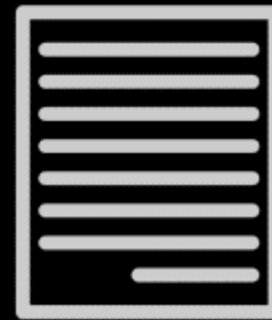

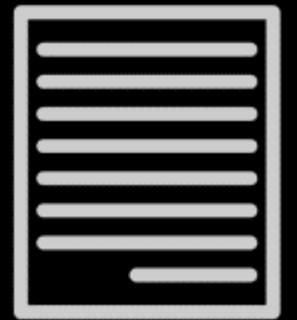

Evaluation of the processes used:

- How useful was each process for answering your question?
- Explain why, including examples.
- Consider pluses and minuses including reliability etc.

Evaluation of decisions made:

- How did you respond to any challenges or opportunities?
- Why was this a good/bad decision?
- What was outcome for project/process?



# Evaluation of outcome:

- How well has your research answered the question? Explain why, considering both strengths and weaknesses.
- How might your research be useful to others? How could you or others extend on this research to make it more valuable?
- How useful is it for you personally ie what have you learned, not just info but skills etc?

S – Scenario: What was the challenge/opportunity

A – Action: What decision did I make?

J – Judgement: Was this a good decision?
